Male Athlete of the Year



Kyle Murray

Kyle is a world class athlete, currently ranked second in Canada and top 40 world ranking for skeleton, the sport where one reaches speeds upwards to 145 km/hr headfirst down the bobsled track. He is on the national team and represented Canada on the 2021/2022 World Cup Tour and Intercontinental Cup Tour, racing in North America, Europe, and Asia through the season. Kyle was first alternate on the 2022 Canadian Winter Olympic Team and was invited to the Beijing Olympic test event in the fall of 2021, where he was able to compete on the new Olympic track. Kyle is a leader and well respected on the national team.

Kyle attended school at Jennie Emery, RI Baker, and Kate Andrews, where he excelled in school and club sports. Currently in Calgary, Kyle trains with the national skeleton team. His family resides in Coaldale, but he still has a strong attachment to the community, with the word "Coaldale" professionally designed and prominently displayed on his competition helmet. At the U of L collegiate level, Kyle captured the annual MVP for track and field three years in a row. While competing in track and field events, including his time in Coaldale, he won a top three placing over 100 times. Kyle is a proud product of Coaldale and has well represented the community as an elite athlete.
